## RENOVATION PLAN IN PLACE FOR XI XI CHAPTER Sigma Chi Needs Your Help

Here's a quick review of where we are and where we're going in 2011, the first year of our three-year construction plan. Projections indicate that our multi-year construction may allow us to accrue the cash required to cover costs with little or no need of borrowing money, but this will ultimately depend upon alumni support. Also, by keeping the Chapter in the house, the house corporation will have rent monies to cover its fixed expenses of \$100,000 a year. We don't want to have to borrow money to pay these expenses.

As has been reported, we'll renovate all bathrooms in the house and build a new unisex unit in the basement. This will be done in the old laundry room space with a new, larger laundry room to be built—by May—in the south-east corner of the basement to accommodate additional washers and dryers which the Chapter badly needs. The basement improvements will be finished by the end of the school year.

We also will finish the refinement of the décor on the front of the house this spring and we are looking at a new north entryway, possibly a covered area, allowing better protection from the weather. We also are looking at general improvement of the area on the north side, which is certainly the least attractive part of the house exterior. We are getting architect bids on this work and the design of the room extension off the dining room which will be done the summer of 2012. We have begun estimating the projects of higher costs, such as the HVAC system and sprinkler system.

We will also tile the floors to the dining room and the handicap bathroom and replace the wall covering in the north hallway. We also intend to re-roof the new wing. Both will be done this summer.

We are using Sigma Chi alumni help wherever we can in terms of materials. Our thanks go to **Mike Wilson '84**, who is aiding us in a large measure financially in acquiring floor and wall tile for the bathrooms and sink counters and shower and toilet partitions.

Our renovation plan is designed to achieve a modern house, competitive with University dorms and other fraternities. We will accomplish this professionally but without undue architects' and major contractors' fees. The work is being closely supervised by **George Gale '54**, **Dave Bear '65**, and **Mike Wilson '84**. ## MU Fraternity Alumni Consortium Seeks to Improve Greek Life at Mizzou RESPONSIBILITY NUMBER ONE PRIORITY

"**Fat, drunk, and stupid is no way to go through life, son,**" said Dean Wormer in the classic movie *Animal House*. *Animal House* ranks as one of the all-time hit movies because it portrays all the excesses that made college life so much fun. Unfortunately, that is also the way many people view the Greek life experience at the University of Missouri.

A new organization at MU hopes to change that perspective. Organized in 2009, the MU Fraternity

Alumni Consortium consists of the presidents of the house corporations of 28 fraternities at the University of Missouri. The Greek system at Mizzou provides over \$100 million worth of housing to university students. As the landlords of their fraternity houses, the consortium seeks to align the Greek system with the goals of the university and stresses recruiting membership based on academic achievement, leadership development, and community service.

Most people get little, if any, leadership experience in high school. At most high schools, the four people elected to the student council are the same four people on the student council at graduation. For many people, college provides little improvement. Moving into the dormitory, they get to know 5-10 people on their floor, and outside of organizing a few dormitory parties, gain get little in the way of leadership experience.

## Consortium Seeks to Improve Greek Life

On the other hand, fraternity life provides instant friendships within a large group of people dedicated to each other's academic and social success. Fraternities at Mizzou run large chapter budgets, typically from \$250,000 to \$750,000. Members work together to run their chapter activities. They learn leadership skills by being members of a team or chairing a committee. Every member is expected to contribute. From chairing a committee to becoming president of the fraternity, there are many leadership opportunities. Greek life at Mizzou turns out graduates that are well rounded in their ability to work with people of different temperaments, talents and convictions. In short, the primary reason for Greek organizations to exist is that they provide a social network of close friendships that often last a lifetime and leadership development skills that cannot be learned anywhere else on campus.

The benefits of Greek life at Mizzou do not mean the fraternity system is immune from the problems that plague campus life elsewhere. All universities have behavioral problems like drugs and alcohol, but often the university's options for dealing with these problems are limited. As the landlords of the fraternity system, Consortium members have a tool the university does not have—the power of the lease. Through its ownership of the house, the Consortium can evict members who violate the rules of alcohol and drug use. The Consortium has begun a voluntary behavioral audit program that conducts random inspections of the second and third floor of Consortium member chapters as a means of controlling unauthorized events. These events often include alcohol consumption and occur spontaneously on Thursday through Saturday nights. The Consortium notifies the chapter house corporation of the violations, and the house corporation turns it over to the chapter officers to address the issue. The house corporation has at their disposal a menu of penalties to impose on the chapter if the issue is not dealt with in an expeditious manner; penalties range from suspension of social privileges to reduced participation in Greek Week, Homecoming and other Greek events.
